

## MINUTES OF ST GEORGE'S PCC MEETING HELD IN THE CHURCH ON TUESDAY 22<sup>ND</sup> FEBRUARY 2011

2. **Minutes of last PCC meeting on 17th January**

3. **Matters Arising**  
None
4. **Treasurer's Report**  
Dawn gave the following report:  
  
The closing bank balance at the end of January was £21,674.62.  
  
Transactions that occurred during the month which need to be mentioned are the sales figure which includes £30 from the sale of church diaries and £103 from plant sales [Jane will send a letter of thanks to David, Len and Anna for their ongoing work] Jane  
  
Included in the fundraising figure is an amount of £348.53 which relates to the church's share from Burn's Night.  
  
Liturgical donations include £89.13 from votive sales.  
  
Included in donations is an amount of £120.25. This has been received from Santander and is a matched donation claimed by Sue Andrews on the craft goods that she has made and sold during 2010. This claim can be put through once a year and Sue does all the paperwork herself. [Jane will send a letter of thanks to Sue on behalf of the PCC]. Jane  
  
On the expenditure side, the clergy expenses include the telephone bill which is for 3 months and therefore looks like we are over budget, and on the same lines the figure of £337.95 in photocopier expenses is the quarterly bill for the machine rental.  
  
The total raised from the tower boxes that Lesley and Dick made has come to £635.22 so far although I know that there are still some more to come in as members of the congregation have approached me and said they are still filling them up.
4. a) **Charities Treasurer's Report**  
Linda reported that the 2 weeks retiring collections in January for St Mary Axim raised £54.76 and the 2 weeks for the Mothers Union Overseas Development Fund raised £52.58.  
  
Money collected for the Rowans Hospice at Jules funeral totalled £363.85 plus £285 from the raffle at the Show making a total of £648.85.

**ACTION**

Dawn will give this to Tony to hand over to the Rowans personally. There is also a further amount of around £200 in cheques which were made out to the Rowans direct.

5. **Report from Charities Committee**

Linda, Candy, Barbie, Fr Timon and Fr Mike met on 25<sup>th</sup> January to select the PCC supported charities for the year March 2011 to February 2012. They tried to give an equal spread between local, national and international charities but these are weighted by the involvement of members of the congregation in particular charities. Information should be displayed in church about the charity each month. Linda Wainwright proposed that the PCC accept these charities as set out for the next 12 months, this was seconded by Anne Morgan and agreed unanimously.

6. a) **Fabric and Finance and Quinquennial**

Minutes already circulated. Dick said that the Hall Committee usually donate £1,000 to the PCC each year although they are not duty bound to do so. David Cavey has done a forecast budget for the hall for this year and it is extremely tight but they will try to donate the £1K this year. The PCC are happy with this.

Dick said he and Colin met with Daniel, the Architect, when he did the final inspection of the tower regarding the leaks in the main church roof. The problem is with the ridge on the main roof particularly when there is rain and a strong wind. They have had two quotes for repairing this. Need to seal the roof to the ridge but Daniel is worried that this will not allow it to breathe and could cause problems in the future. They are now working on a solution which will cost around £2,100. We don't need a Faculty for this but do need a Schedule B. Dick needs to sort this out by Monday and return it to the DAC and needs a copy of the PCC resolution to go with it. Colin proposed that we go ahead with the repair of the church roof as specified by Daniel at a cost of around £2,100 (plus Architect's fees which are up to about £700 so far) and this was seconded by Dick and agreed unanimously by 11 members of the PCC. Richard will inform the insurance company that the work is going ahead on the roof once a date is agreed.
